DISCOVERING YOUR MINISTRY CLASS 301

I. THE BASIS FOR THIS CLASS:

"And He gave some *as* apostles, and some *as* prophets, and some *as* evangelists, and some *as* pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ;" (Ephesians 4:11-12)

II. THE FOCUS OF THIS CLASS:

What God made you to <u>BE</u> determines what He intends for you to <u>DO</u>.

God is consistent in His plan for each of our lives. He would not give us inborn talents and temperaments, spiritual gifts, and all sorts of life experiences and then not use them! The focus of this class is to help you discover the ministry you've been created for.

The two results of discovering the ministry you've been created for are:

- 1. <u>Fulfillment</u>
- 2. <u>Fruitfulness</u>

III. WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS ABOUT MINISTRY?

- A. Ministry is using <u>whatever</u> God has given you to serve Him and the needs of others.
- B. We minister in three directions:
 - 1. To the Lord. (Acts 13:2-3)
 - 2. To <u>believers</u>. (Hebrews 6:10)
 - 3. To <u>non-believers</u>. (Matthew 5:13)

- C. We minister to three areas of needs:
 - 1. To people's <u>physical needs</u>. (Matthew 25:35-40)
 - 2. To people's <u>emotional needs</u>. (1 Thessalonians 5:14)
 - 3. To people's <u>spiritual needs</u>. (2 Corinthians 5:18; Colossians 1:28-29)

IV. THE PURPOSE OF MINISTRY

"And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all *persons*. But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (1 Corinthians 12:5-7)

God wants to use you for the <u>common good</u> of the church.

V. THE PRIORITY OF MINISTRY

A life changing truth is that your primary identity is you are a minister of Jesus Christ!

- 1. You've been <u>created</u> for ministry. (Ephesians 2:10)
- 2. You've been <u>saved</u> for ministry. (2 Timothy 1:9)
- 3. You've been <u>called</u> into ministry. (Ephesians 4:1)
- 4. You've been <u>gifted</u> for ministry. (1 Peter 4:10)
- 5. You've been <u>authorized</u> for ministry. (Matthew 28:18-19)
- 6. You've been <u>commanded</u> to minister. (Matthew 20:28)
- 7. You've been <u>equipped</u> for ministry. (Ephesians 4:11-12)
- 8. The body of Christ <u>needs</u> your ministry. (1 Corinthians 12:27)

(Ministry always functions in the context of the church family. (Matthew 9:36-37))

- 9. You are <u>accountable</u> for your ministry. (Romans 14:12; Matthew 25:14-30)
- 10. You will be <u>rewarded</u> for your ministry. (Colossians 3:23-24; Matthew 25:23)

VI. HOW TO DISCOVER YOUR MINISTRY

- 1. Dedicate <u>vourself</u>. (Romans 12:1)
- 2. Eliminate <u>competing distractions</u>. (Romans 12:2)
- 3. Evaluate <u>your strengths</u>. (Romans 12:3)
- 4. Cooperate <u>with other believers</u>. (Romans 12:4-5)
- 5. Use <u>your gifts</u>. (Romans 12:6-8)

God uses an anatomy lesson in 1 Corinthians 12:1-31 to teach us the following important truths:

- 1. Every member is a <u>minister</u> in Christ's body.
- 2. Every member has a <u>different function</u>.
- 3. Every member's ministry is important.
- 4. Every member belongs to the <u>other members</u>.

VII. HOW HAS GOD SHAPED YOU FOR MINISTRY?

A. God has been molding and shaping you for ministry since you were born. In fact, God started uniquely shaping you even before you were born. (Psalm 139:14-16)

- 1. You were shaped for <u>a purpose</u>.
- 2. You are <u>unique</u>.
- 3. You are <u>wonderfully made</u>.

- B. Your shape will determine your ministry.
- 1. <u>Spiritual Gifts</u> (What are you gifted to do?)
 - a. Only <u>believers</u> have spiritual gifts. (1 Corinthians 2:14)
 - b. Every Christian has at least <u>one</u> gift. (1 Corinthians 7:7)
 - c. No one receives <u>all</u> the gifts. (1 Corinthians 12:27-30)
 - d. No single gift is given to <u>everyone</u>. (1 Corinthians 12:29-30)
 - e. You cannot <u>earn or work for a spiritual gift</u>. (Ephesians 4:7)
 - f. The <u>Holy Spirit</u> decides what gifts you get. (1 Corinthians 12:11)
 - g. The gifts you are given are <u>permanent</u>. (Romans 11:29)
 - h. You are to <u>develop</u> the gifts God gives you. (1 Timothy 4:14)
 - i. It is a sin to <u>waste</u> the gifts God gives you. (1 Corinthians 4:1-2)
 - j. Using your gifts <u>glorifies</u> God and <u>grows</u> you. (John 15:8)
- 2. <u>Heart</u> (What do you love to do?)
- 3. <u>Abilities</u> (What natural talents and skills do you have?)
- 4. <u>Personality</u> (Where does your personality best suit you to serve?)

- 5. <u>Experiences</u> (What experiences have you had?)
 - a. What <u>spiritual</u> experiences have you had?
 - b. What painful experiences have you had?
 - c. What <u>educational</u> experiences have you had?

Your ministry will be most effective and fulfilling when you are using your <u>GIFTS</u> and <u>ABILITIES</u> in the area of your <u>HEART'S DESIRE</u> in a way that best expresses your <u>PERSONALITY</u> and <u>EXPERIENCES</u>.

Therefore I, the prisoner of the Lord, implore you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called,

10 As each one has received a *special* gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

36 Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them, because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd. **37** Then He *said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.

Romans 14:12

12 So then each one of us will give an account of himself to God.

Colossians 3:23-24

23 Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men, **24** knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve.

Romans 12:1-8

Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, *which is* your spiritual service of worship. **2** And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

3 For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think; but to think so as to have sound judgment, as God has allotted to each a measure of faith. **4** For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, **5** so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. **6** Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, *each of us is to exercise them accordingly*: if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith; **7** if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; **8** or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

Psalm 139:14-16

14 I will give thanks to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made;

Wonderful are Your works,

And my soul knows it very well.

15 My frame was not hidden from You,

When I was made in secret,

And skillfully wrought in the depths of the earth;

16 Your eyes have seen my unformed substance;

And in Your book were all written

The days that were ordained for me,

When as yet there was not one of them.

1 Corinthians 2:14

14 But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised.

1 Corinthians 7:7

However, each man has his own gift from God, one in this manner, and another in that.

1 Corinthians 12:27-30

27 Now you are Christ's body, and individually members of it. **28** And God has appointed in the church, first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, administrations, *various* kinds of tongues. **29** All are not apostles, are they? All are not prophets, are they? All are not teachers, are they? All are not *workers of* miracles, are they? **30** All do not have gifts of healings, do they? All do not speak with tongues, do they? All do not interpret, do they?

Ephesians 4:7

7 But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift.

1 Corinthians 12:11

11 But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills.

Romans 11:29

29 for the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable.

1 Timothy 4:14

14 Do not neglect the spiritual gift within you, which was bestowed on you through prophetic utterance with the laying on of hands by the presbytery.

1 Corinthians 4:1-2

Let a man regard us in this manner, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. **2** In this case, moreover, it is required of stewards that one be found trustworthy.

John 15:8

8 My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be My disciples.
